





Rent a room or an apartment


The key points for renting a room or apartment are:




Always ensure a legal contract is in place before making any payments, and visit the place before finalizing anything.



Amenities like water, WiFi, and gas might not be included unless specified in the contract, so inquire about them.



Expect a deposit (one or two months' rent) that should be refunded at the end of your lease, typically lasting at least a year.



Negotiating lease terms with the owner might affect the price, and using intermediaries like real estate agencies could involve extra fees. While involving intermediaries might add to the cost, it can provide added safety – ensure you understand all terms to avoid surprises.




CO-LIVING AND RESIDENCES

KEEP YOUR STUDENTS' VISAS ON POINT

As a student, you must be legally residing in Spain. But applying for a student visa to stay in Spain for longer than 90 days is usually a standard process. You simply need to collect the required documents, head to the nearest consulate, and submit the paperwork.

Note: Scan your documentation and email it to yourself, so you will always be able to access a copy in case of loss or theft.

VISA PROCESS

HOW TO APPLY?

Visa applications must be submitted in person by the applicant or by one of their parents if the applicant is a minor. They may also be submitted through a duly accredited representative.

Visa application period: The application must be submitted no earlier than 90 days prior to the planned date of travel. Visa applications must be submitted sufficiently in advance of the beginning of the pertinent study programs, as the procedure entails consultations with other authorities.

Place of submission: Applications must be submitted in person at the Consular Office. An appointment is necessary.

***Required documents:**

- A valid passport for at least 90 days beyond the intended stay in Spain.
- A completed visa application form.
- A recent passport-size photograph.
- A letter of acceptance from a Spanish university or school.
- Proof of health insurance that covers the stay in Spain.
- Proof of financial support that shows enough money to cover his/her living expenses in Spain (at least 580 €/month).
- A criminal background check.
- Medical certificate.

Decision period: The legal period for reaching a decision is of 1 month from the day after the application submission date, but this period may be extended if an interview or additional documents are requested.

If the study stay is for longer than 6 months, the visa will be valid for a 90-day stay. The student must apply for a Foreigner Identity Card within a period of 1 month from their entry into Spain, at the Foreign Nationals' Office or the Police Station of the province in which the permit was processed.

Visa application fee: 60€ aprox.
