Paris Campus is located in the 8th arrondissement, **just a few steps** away from the Arc de Triomphe.

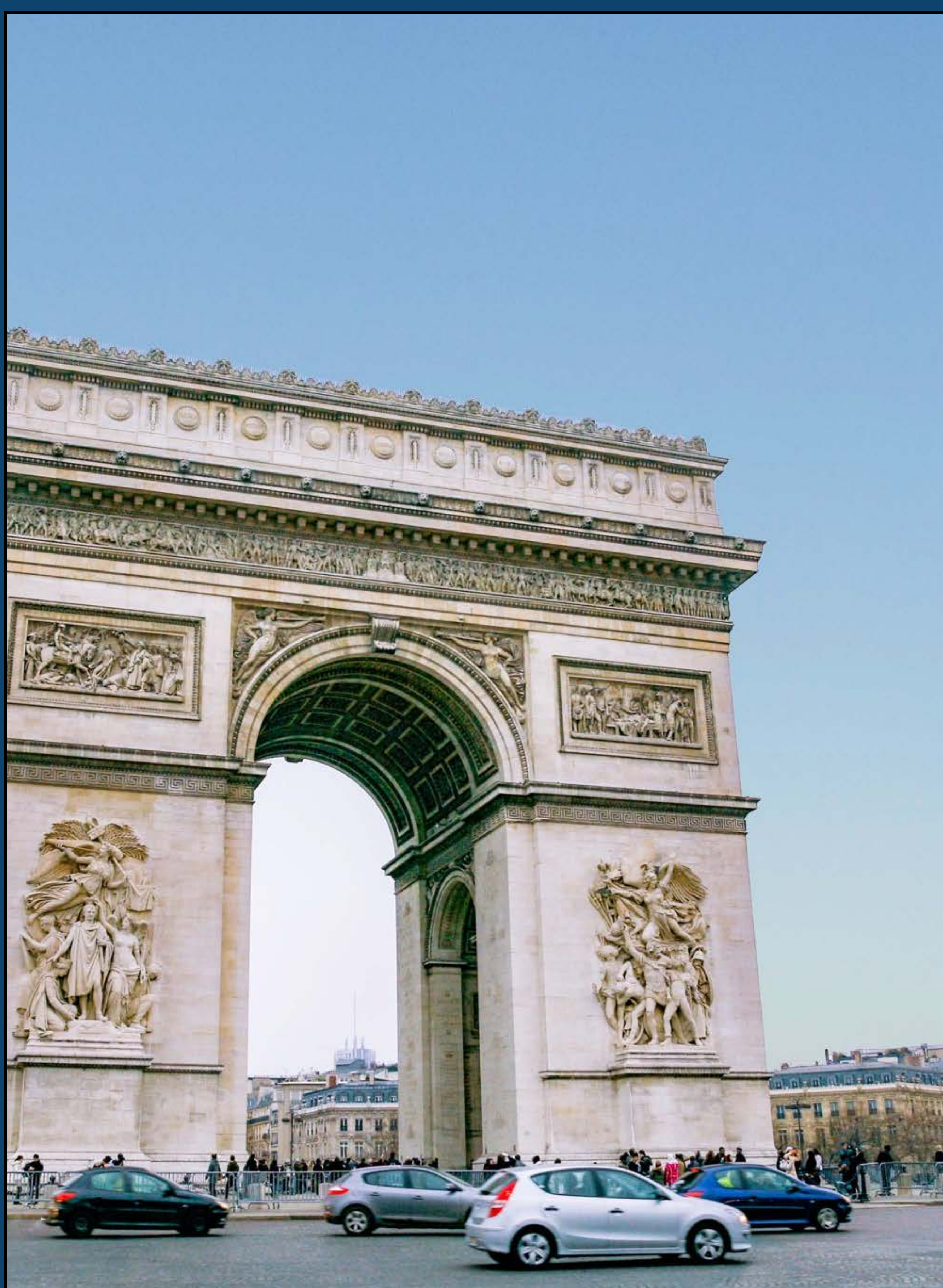

TO RENT A CAR

You must be 25 years old or over and have held a license for at least one year. (There are some agencies that accept drivers aged 21-24).

You need to have your driver's license and passport with you.

You can find most international rent-a-car companies such as Avis, Europcar, Hertz, or Ada in Paris and at airports.



TAXI

Taxi fares are based on area, time, and pieces of luggage.

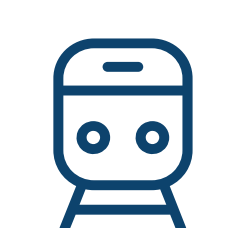
Most journeys in central Paris average €20-40, whereas taxi rides from/to the Paris airports are up to €80.

PARIS METRO

Is the most common (and the fastest) way of transportation.

Tickets can be bought at every metro station.

TRAIN

RER: Some of the major tourist attractions are in the suburbs, such as the Château de Versailles or Disneyland Paris, and are **served by the local RER train network.**

SNCF: Most locations further away from Paris are served by SNCF (the state railway). [SNCF Info](#)

TGV: The TGV (Train à grande Vitesse) is a high-speed train. But, you have to book in advance and pay a supplement.

Good to know:

- You are under 26? Benefit from a 25% discount in blue periods (specific dates and hours), except for TGVs.
- If you are planning to stay at least a year: it is best to buy a year-long discount card (Carte 12/15) to benefit from a 50% discount on all trains (a 25% discount on TGVs) in blue periods or a 25% discount for the rest of the time. Important discounts are also made for international journeys.

TRAVEL BY PLANE

There are two airports that connect the city to different parts of the world:

ROISSY-CHARLES DE GAULLE

Located 30 km northeast of Paris, it has two terminals that are somewhat far from each other. There is a 24-hour information service in English: 01 48 62 22 80.

Transportation to Paris:

- RER B
- Taxis
- Air France buses
- Roissy buses
- Some other airport shuttles go to different points in Paris.
- There is also an SNCF train station at Terminal 2.

ORLY AIRPORT It is 18 km south of the city, but very well connected to the capital. It also boasts two terminals: Orly-Sud (international flights), and Orly-Ouest (domestic flights).

Transportation to Paris: The best options are Orlyval and RER B, which also connect to Roissy airport, taxis, Orlybuses, or Air France buses.

Horse-Racing

The major horse-racing events take place in October with the Bois de Boulogne – the Prix de la République and the Grand Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.



Squash

Located at the foot of the Sacré-Cœur, Squash Montmartre is the ideal place to unwind. It has four courts, saunas, fitness equipment, and a restaurant. Fares are around €13 per person, per hour.

Another option is the Club Quartier Latin, which charges between 21€ - 31€ depending on the time of day.

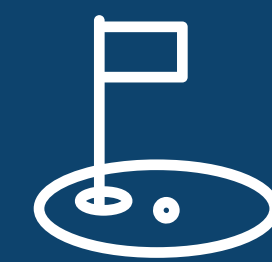

Obtain a Carte Paris-Tennis from the Mairie or directly access municipal courts at €7 - €20 per hour.

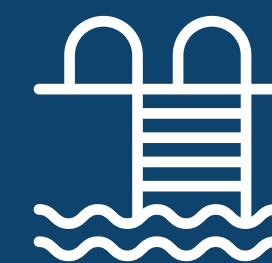
Explore private clubs such as Forest Hill Tennis at Aquaboulevard for an engaging and relaxing time.

Swimming

The underground Piscine Suzanne-Berlioux is extremely central and open daily.

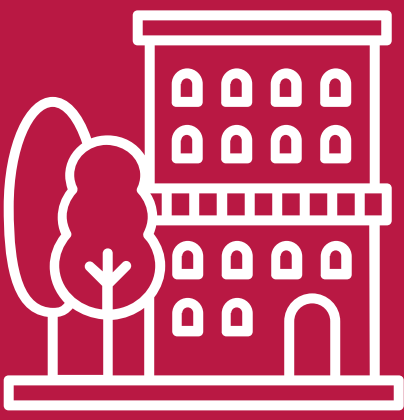
Gyms/health clubs

ARRIVING IN FRANCE

STUDENT VISA PROCESS

Step 1: Campus France Application

- First mandatory step.
- Independent but complementary to the visa application.
- Specific platform for students applying from one of the 46 countries subject to the "Études en France" procedure.
- Processing time: Up to 3 weeks.
- Start anytime upon receiving the university acceptance package.

Step 2: Visa Application

- Minimum 2-3 weeks after in-person appointment.
- Processing time: Students can initiate the visa application process a maximum of 90 days before the departure date.

***Main requirements:**

- Original passport
- Proof of academic status (Prior diplomas)
- University acceptance letters
- Tuition & fees payment receipt + Scholarship letter (if applicable)
- Proof of financial means: *615 euros per month (excluding housing and tuition fees)
- Proof of accommodation (at least 3 months)
- Health/travel insurance
- Curriculum Vitae (C.V)

*As per official requirements. This information can change, so please, check the official French Government websites for updated information.
